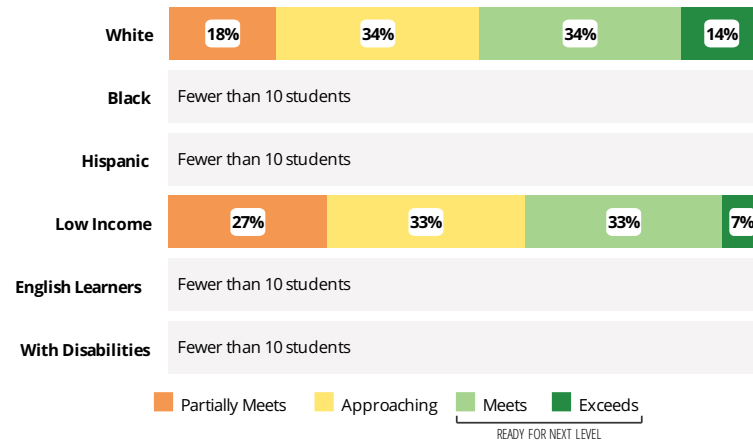
Academic Success

Success by Student Group

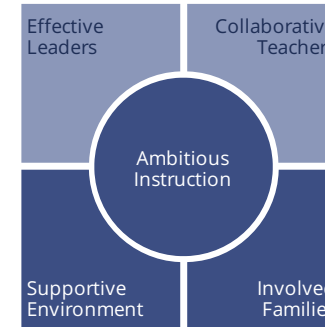
This display shows SAT performance levels for each student group. No data is shown for groups with fewer than 10 students.



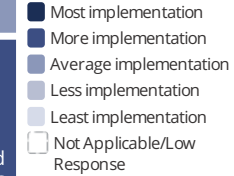

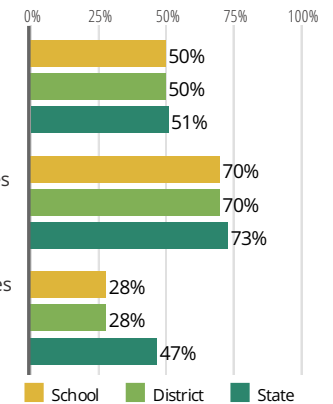

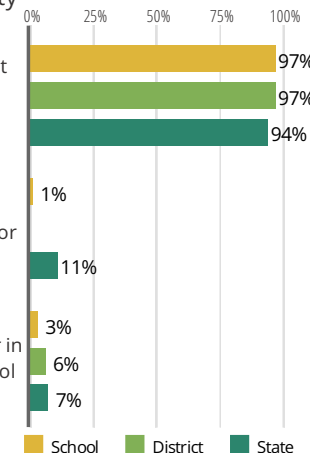
Educator Measures

Student Attendance and Mobility

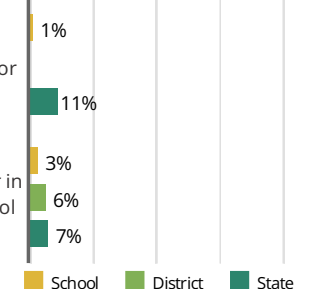
Attendance Rate
