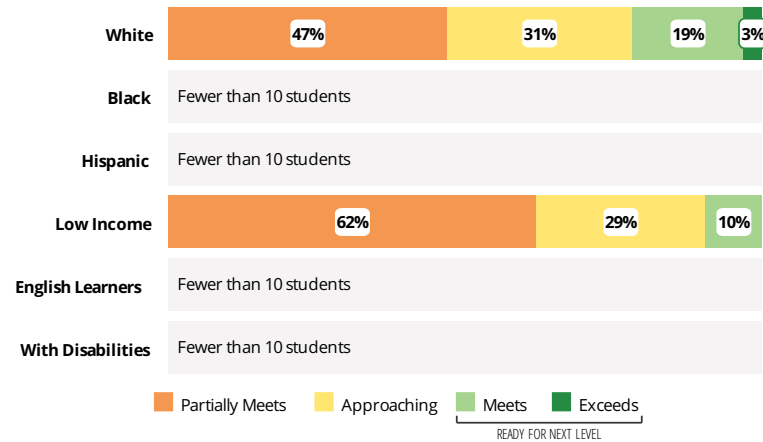

Success by Student Group

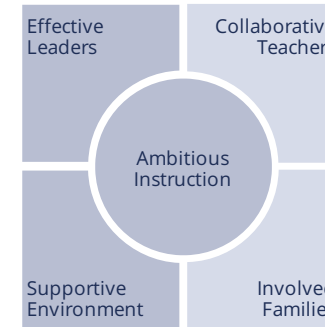
This display shows SAT performance levels for each student group. No data is shown for groups with fewer than 10 students.

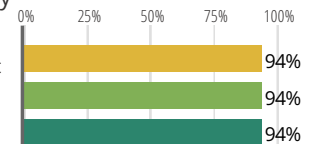
Educator Measures
