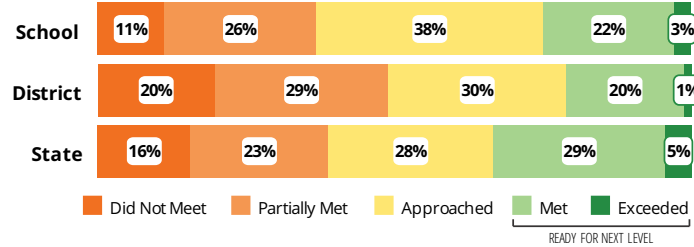

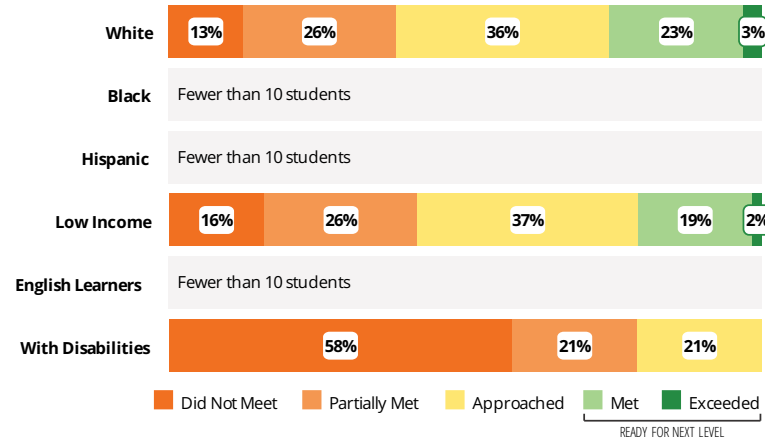
Academic Success

This display shows PARCC performance levels for each student group. No data is shown for groups with fewer than 10 students.



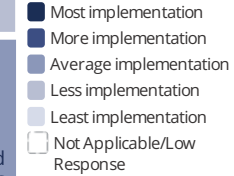

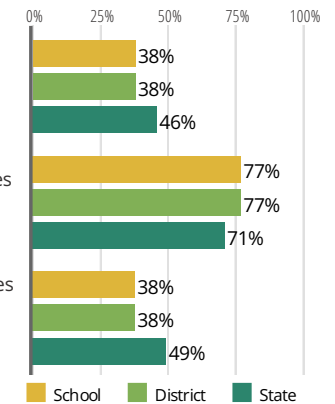

School Highlights

Academic Courses

For a small high school, Trico offers a nice variety of academic and elective courses. Beyond core courses, Trico offers elective courses in Business, Home Economics and Agriculture. We also offer various courses in music and art. We are particularly proud of our Performing Arts class from which we put on several theatrical productions each year.

Physical Education, Health and Wellness

Physical Education is required for all students. We offer a number of recreational, fitness and team sport activities in our classes. Students get one semester of health education during their freshman year.

Other Programs and Activities

Trico has had continued success since partnering with local community members to provide an opportunity for our students' to shoot trap. Trico is the home of the 2013 National Trap shooting champion. We are particularly proud of our Performing Arts program, hosting drama and musical productions each fall and spring in the Gerald Speith Auditorium.

School Awards

Trico has experienced continued success in many areas including Agriculture, Fine Arts and Athletics. The girls softball team finished 2nd at the IHSA State Softball tournament in 2014.

Career Development Courses and Programs

Trico offers various Career Development Courses in the area of Business and Technology, Agriculture and Home Economics. We offer 23 different Career Development Courses which a student can take over the course of his/her high school career.

Athletics

Trico prides itself in successful athletic programs. Trico offers 8 different varsity level sports programs for students. Boys golf had a state tournament appearance in 2004 and Girl's Softball finished 2nd in 2014.

Trico employs high quality support personnel that work with teachers and administrators to help make Trico a positive experience for all students.

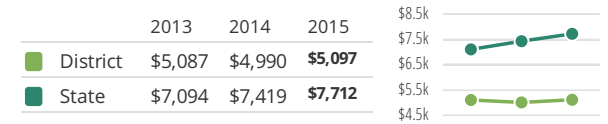
Facilities

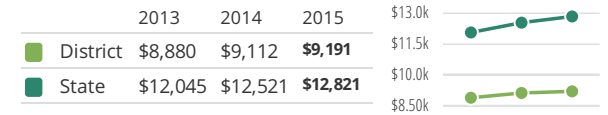
Most of this data has been collected by ISBE from school districts through data systems. Some information, such as the School Highlights, is entered directly by principals and can be updated throughout the year.

Attendance Rate

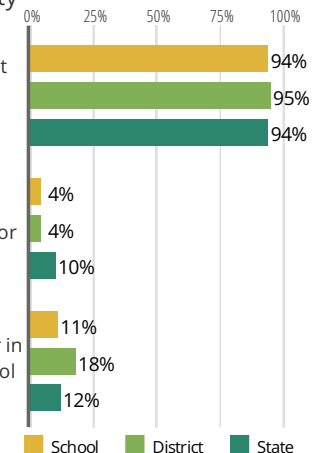
Rate at which students are present at school, not including excused or unexcused absences
