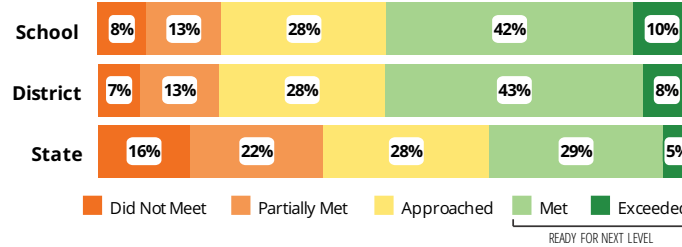

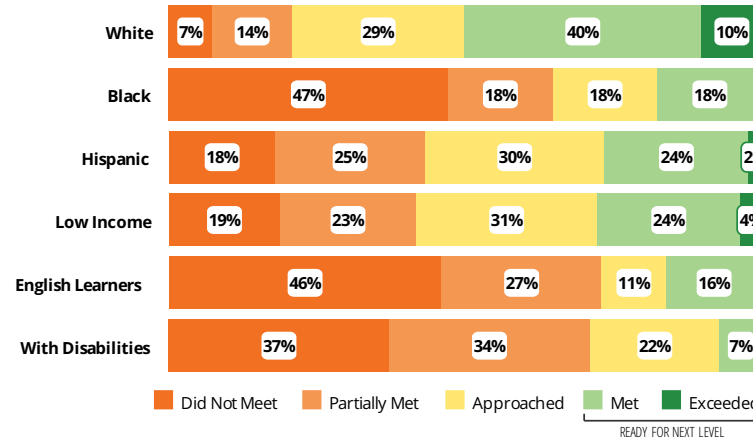
Academic Success

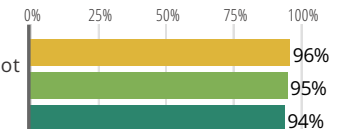

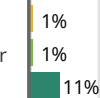
Attendance Rate

Rate at which students are present at school, not including excused or unexcused absences



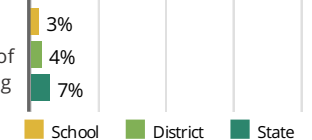
Chronic Truancy Rate

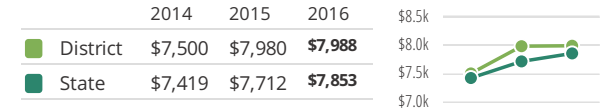

Facilities

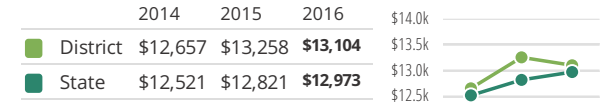
Wredling Middle School, built in 1995, has instructional spaces supported with technology resources. The building was built based on a middle school concept. Students have fine arts and exploratory classrooms, including PLTW labs, and a Learning Resource Center. The school has two gym spaces, a fitness room, outdoor track, and sports fields.

District Finance
