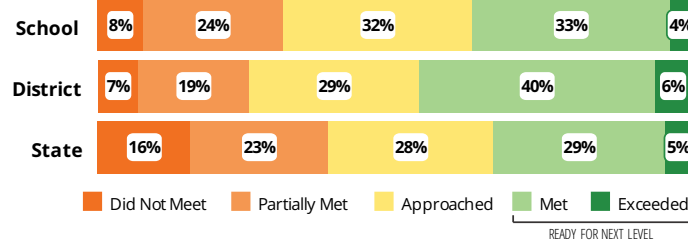

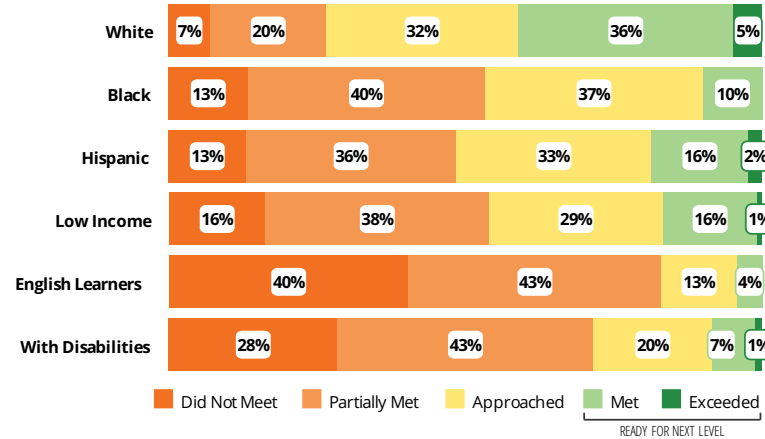
Academic Success

Success by Student Group

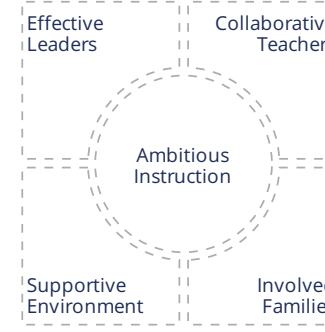

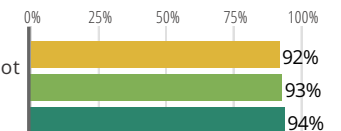

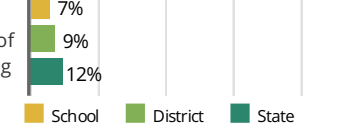
Chronic Truancy Rate

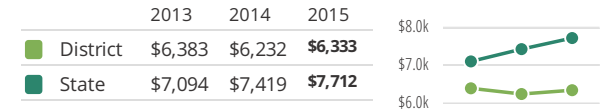

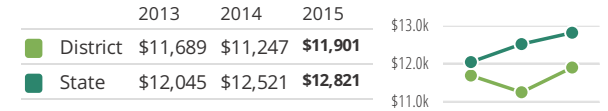
