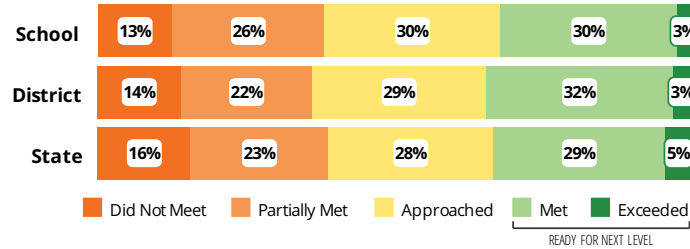

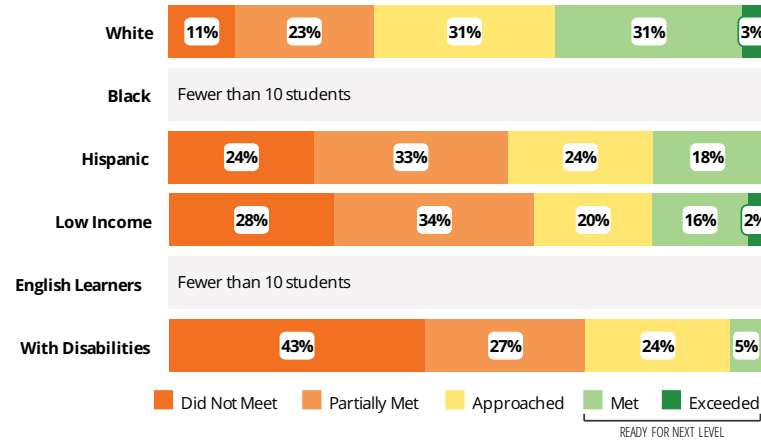
Academic Success

This display shows PARCC performance levels for each student group. No data is shown for groups with fewer than 10 students.

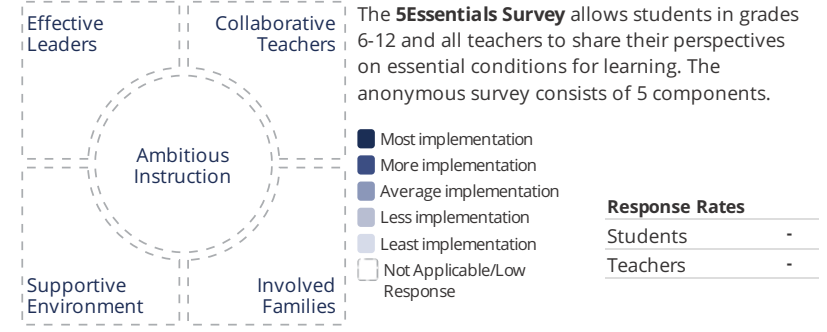

The **5Essentials Survey** allows students in grades 6-12 and all teachers to share their perspectives on essential conditions for learning. The anonymous survey consists of 5 components.



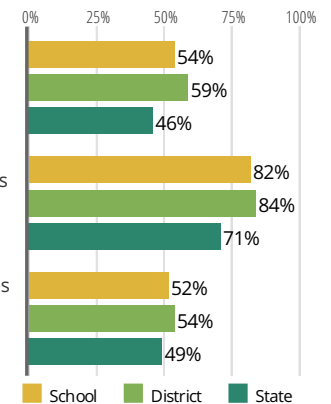

School Highlights

Academic Courses

ACHS offers a comprehensive set of courses across 9 academic departments. In addition to 23 AP offerings (including AP Capstone), ACHS has a robust slate of dual credit courses, world language opportunities, career tech ed offerings, and fine/applied art classes, as part of the 128 electives aimed at meeting the needs and interests of our students.

Physical Education, Health and Wellness

ACHS values the physical education & health of its students. In addition to 9 course offerings in PE, students can take a combined course in food & fitness. ACHS offers a student assistance program, a student support team, and various social-emotional groups.

Other Programs and Activities

ACHS has been recognized as a Top 100 HS in IL, in addition to, being labeled a Democracy School. ACHS boasts a robust Cum Laude Graduation Recognition Program. Participation in activities/clubs is a platform for students to contribute to the school and beyond. ACHS has many community partnerships that serve its students.

School Awards

Top 100 Schools in IL (2015); 4 Those Who Excel Honorees; 3 IMEA Winners; 19 Var. IHSA Team Academic Achievement Awards; Multiple Regional, Sectional, & State Qualifying Teams/Individuals; All KEMPA Award for Newspaper (Tom Tom) & Yearbook (Sequoia), Community Scholarships totaling approx \$51,450 and over 2 Million from post-secondary institutions.

Career Development Courses and Programs

ACHS offers 29 different courses in business, family consumer science, and technology education as a part of its Career and Technical Education Department. ACHS students may chose from 22 different career programs from the Lake County Technology Campus, some of which can also be taken for dual credit.

Athletics

ACHS offers 23 sporting activities to its students; 21 are recognized by the IHSA. The various programs are divided into 3 seasons: fall, winter, and spring. ACHS student-athletes compete throughout the school year as part of the Northern Lake County Conference.

School Personnel Resources

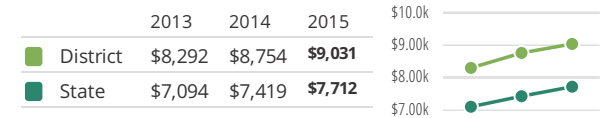

Facilities

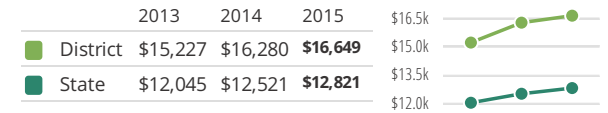

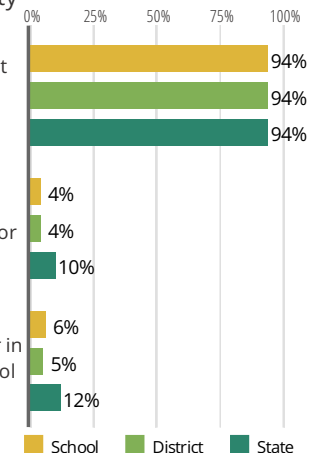
Educator Measures

Student Attendance and Mobility

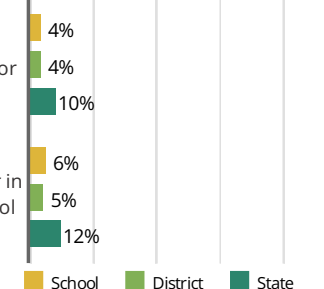
Attendance Rate

Rate at which students are present at school, not including excused or unexcused absences



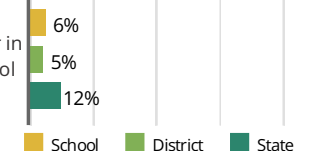
Chronic Truancy Rate
